Transfer from Sarajevo airport to Mostar. Overnights in Mostar (two nights).

The heart of the old town, highlighted by the Stari Most and the turquoise Neretva River that flows below it, has been a magnet for tourists for many decades. This quaint Ottoman old quarter is a living tribute to the ingenuity and beauty of Ottoman architecture.

3. – 4. day; Jajce – Banja Luka

After breakfast drive Mostar – Jajce – Banja Luka. Overnight in Banja Luka (one night).

Visit BiH's second largest city Banja Luka and dine in the Castellum fort alongside the emerald green Vrbas River. It is the largest and most developed city and has traditionally been the center of the Bosanska Krajina region located in the northwestern part of the country. The city lies on the Vrbas River, one of the most beautiful mountain rivers, and is well-known as the city of greenery, namely it is full of tree-lined avenues, boulevards, gardens and parks.

Jajce best represents the multi-layered historical mosaic stemming back from pre-Roman times to Tito's Yugoslavia. This fortified hilltop town offers a fun-filled mélange of cultural and natural heritage. See the mysterious Roman era catacombs or walk the ancient city walls in the town centre.

The Pliva Lake just outside of Jajce is a famous fishing spot and a favorite water sports destination for kayaking, canoeing, swimming, or just enjoying the tranquility of the lake.














A taste of the Orient in Europe





After a two hour drive from Sarajevo, the group will arrive at the deep and picturesque canyon of Sutjeska River, then head towards Dragos Saddle to take a peek at the Skaka¬vac waterfall deep in Perucica's Valley. The participants will walk around the forest; thick and teeming with endemic flora, and move on to Prijevor for more incredible views of this majestic park – ringed by the towering Maglic, Zelengora and Volujak.

The Neretva River is the emerald of Herzegovina flowing over 100 kilometers from its source into the Adriatic Sea. Sarajevo is the "Jerusalem of Europe." It is home to over 240 types of migratory birds and dozens that make their permanent home in the sub-Mediterranean wetlands surrounding Deransko Lake..."
